MANDATORY FIREARMS TRAINING

A Mandatory Firearms Training Course will be held **September 2, 3, 9 and 10, 2017** at the Charleston Police Pistol Range, 1251 W. Madison Avenue. The course will be 40 hours in length; four days, ten hours per day. Classes will be held from 0800 hours to 1800 hours each day with the exception of the third day when a night firing exercise will be conducted.

Trainees must be registered through their department – no individual registrations will be accepted. A liability waiver will be distributed on the first day of training.

The following items are to be furnished by each trainee:

1. Pistol (.38, .357, .40, .45, .9mm) plus duty leather gear
2. Ear Protectors
3. Safety Glasses
4. Flashlight
5. 200 rounds duty ammunition
6. 450 rounds commercially reloaded practice ammunition
7. 12 Gage Shotgun (25 rnds. of birdshot; 5 rnds. of slugs; 5 rnds. of 00 buckshot)

Trainees should bring appropriate clothing as well as wet weather gear. The course will be conducted outside regardless of weather conditions.

REGISTRATION POLICY/IMPORTANT REPORTING DETAILS

Carefully follow the directions below or your officer will not be properly registered !

Registration Policy

The Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board now requires that departments file a Form E – Notice of Appointment form on all trainees, prior to the course. Therefore, the following registration policy must be followed.

1. Submit a Form E – Notice of Appointment form to the Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board. (Please keep a copy for your records.)
2. Submit the application form and a copy of the Form E by mail to the East Central IL Mobile Law Enforcement Training Team, PO Box 302, Charleston, IL 61920. No faxes.
3. For safety reasons, the maximum class size is 20 officers. The order of priority of acceptance into the class is as follows:
 1. First Priority – Full-Time Officers
 2. Second Priority – Part-Time Officers
 3. Third Priority – Coroners, Auxiliary Police, Probation Officers

Reporting Policy

In the interest of safety, the following reporting policy is now in effect:

1. ALL TRAINEES MUST ARRIVE AT THE RANGE WITH UNLOADED WEAPONS.
2. All trainees must bring a duty weapon that is clean, functional and appropriate for patrol use.
3. All trainees must have duty leather gear that fits and is functional.
4. All trainees must have a holster that matches their duty weapon.
5. All trainees must have three speed loaders or magazines.
6. All trainees must have factory ammunition, which fires without causing malfunctions.

ATTENTION: IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE REGISTERING AGENCY TO CHECK THE FIREARM, AMMUNITION, AND EQUIPMENT OF THEIR TRAINEE PRIOR TO THE CLASS. TRAINEES BRINGING LOADED WEAPONS OR NOT HAVING THE REQUIRED EQUIPMENT WILL BE SENT HOME.
